Gospel Reflection

LIVE TODAY FULLY

There is an old saying that life is what happens to us while we are busy making other plans. How often do the people and events of today pass unnoticed because we are preoccupied with concerns about the future?

Sometimes after a death in a family, one hears the survivors lament all that they did not do for the deceased. "I was so busy with my career plans, I never spent time with her." "I put so much energy into establishing my place in the community, I forgot he was lonesome."

One would suppose that the birds in the sky do not spend a great deal of time mapping out a lifetime flight plan. They seem to fly where they need to go today, trusting that that will eventually bring them where they must be tomorrow and next winter. Similarly, the wildflowers do not appear to bemoan their plot of earth or jockey for position. Rather, each accepts the sun and rain given it today and grows, imperceptibly perhaps, but beautifully.

FEAST OF FAITH

Postures of the Mass

In the Mass, we pray not only with our lips, but with our bodies as well. We stand when the ministers enter. In Western culture, standing is a sign of attention, a mark of respect: all stand when the judge enters the courtroom, for example. Standing is also an ancient posture of prayer, mentioned frequently in the Old Testament. When the readings begin, we sit down: a listening posture. Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to his teaching; the crowds sat on the hillside or the seashore to hear his words. Kneeling is another posture that is full of meaning. It expresses adoration and worship, but it can also express humility and contrition. We bow: a sign of honor and reverence, acknowledging the presence of God, especially when we receive the Eucharist. And there are other ritual gestures as well—striking the breast, genuflecting, and of course making the sign of the cross. The liturgy invites us to pray with our whole person—with heart and mind, voice and body.

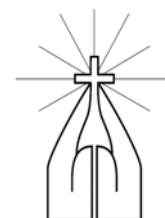

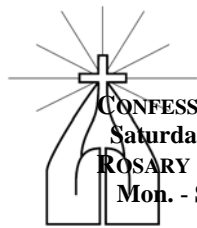

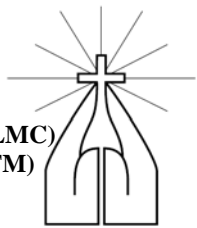

## Weekly Message:

### En Theos — Enthusiasm For The Faith

*My fiancée and I are planning our wedding for next year. We still have to attend classes and meet with a priest. What should we expect from the classes? Does the priest test us to see if we are ready to be married?*

For many years the church has tried to help couples prepare for marriage. The rising divorce rate, as well as the recognition of marriage as a sacrament, led to the development of Marriage Prep Dialogues and Engaged Encounter Weekends. Both programs are designed to encourage couples to discuss the basic fundamentals of relationship within the context of marriage: communication, finance, sexuality, spirituality and values and goals. Open and honest dialogue, as well as a sense of shared values, can make a big difference in a marriage. The classes are not a "how to" course, but provide information and encouragement as you discuss how you will live your married life. The married couples in these programs often share their own experience and information as a guide and example. The priest may give some spiritual insights on how living the sacrament of marriage differs from the legal understanding of marriage. He is not there to test you, but rather to help you cover all the bases and be certain that you and your future spouse are well-informed and prepared to take on the responsibilities and commitment of marriage. The goal of marriage is union and love. Openness, honesty, trust, and love are the glue that keeps couples together for a lifetime.

### Women's World Day of Prayer

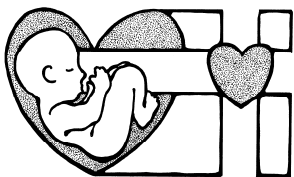
This Friday, St. Thomas More will host the Women's World Day of Prayer. Registration begins at 10:00 AM with the service beginning at 10:30 AM. It should last about an hour and is followed by lunch. If you're available, please join us in welcoming other denominations of the South End. If you're not able to join us, please keep the people of Chile in your prayers on Friday. Below is more information about the World Day of Prayer collected from their website:

Women's World Day of Prayer is a global, ecumenical movement of informed prayer and prayerful action, organised and led by Christian women who call the faithful together on the first Friday in March each year to observe a common day of prayer and who, in many countries, have a continuing relationship in prayer and service.

The service is written by a different country each year and that country then becomes the focus of the world's prayers on the day itself, which begins as dawn breaks over the islands of Tonga in the Pacific and continues across each continent until the last services of this special day are held back in the Pacific, on the islands of Samoa, circling the world in prayer for 36 hours.

On Friday March 4, 2011 the women of Chile invite us to join with them in an opening procession, carrying a "panera", the name that Chileans give to their everyday bread basket. Bread is central to their daily life and sharing bread is a universal sign of hospitality.

Enduring a devastating earthquake in February, 2010, and two other earthquakes since January, 2011, the women of Chile further encourage us to enter a process that draws us into the bible, into the context of Chile and into the real situations of our lives and communities. How many loaves have you? What are your gifts? What can you share? These are questions we are asked to ponder as we reflect on the meaning of the theme, *How Many Loaves Have You?*

## The Senior Connection

### What is a Medigap plan?

Medigap plans are supplemental insurance policies you can buy to help cover some of the costs you have to pay if you have **Original Medicare**. If you don't have other insurance coverage to help pay your Medicare costs, you might want to think about getting a Medigap plan.

There are currently 10 different Medigap plans you can buy: A, B, C, D, F, G, K, L, M and N. Medigap rules changed in June 2010. Plans sold before June 2010 have slightly different benefits than the plans on the market now. All Medigap plans sold starting June 1, 2010 must cover the following:

- ◆ Hospital copay: This is the amount you must pay each day during an inpatient hospital stay.
- ◆ 365 additional hospital days beyond what Original Medicare covers.
- ◆ Part or all of the coinsurance for Part B covered services: The Part B coinsurance is the amount you pay for outpatient services such as doctor visits, x-rays and lab tests.
- ◆ Hospice coinsurances: The hospice coinsurance is 5 percent of the cost of inpatient respite care.

Some Medigap plans also cover: Part B deductible; hospital deductible; skilled nursing facility coinsurance; emergency care outside of the U. S.

Not all Medigap plans are available in all areas. Massachusetts, Minnesota and Wisconsin have their own Medigap systems. Call your state insurance department to find out which plans are available in your area.

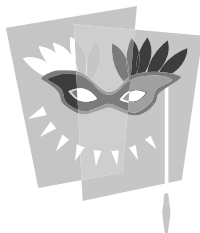
