## Gospel Reflection

### WHAT CAN YOU DO?

The crowd wanted to know, “What can we do to accomplish the works of God?” (John 6:28). They were looking for a way to do miracles, signs, wonders, and they expected Jesus to prove himself by doing this for them, too. They had just witnessed the multiplication of the loaves, yet it seemed not to impress them! They were asking for yet another “sign.” Jesus directed their attention to the meaning of the miracles: God’s loving faithfulness to them in their need. Manna in the desert and loaves in the wilderness were the signs of Jesus’ gift of himself to us in love.

What Jesus was looking for in these people was an attentive heart. He wanted them to see that God was providing for their needs with love and faithfulness, and had always done so. But the people didn’t get it. They had just witnessed a miracle, and yet they still were asking for “a sign.” What counts as a sign? Do we need to be hit over the head? Every day we witness miracles, and yet we don’t really see them, or believe that they really come from God. Every day we are bread for each other, or someone is bread for us, and yet we do not make the connection! No doubt the people in the desert failed to connect the quail and the manna with their crying out to God for food. God answers our prayers and knows our needs, and sends people to us and us to others, and yet we look

for other explanations of these “miracles” in our lives.

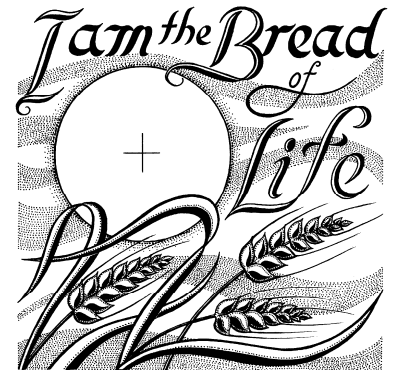
### BELIEVE!

God’s faithful love is shown all around us, every day. We cry out to God, and yet we often explain away God’s answers to our prayers, looking for something more spectacular than merely what we need or even what we have asked for. We have what we need: the Bread of Life.

## Weekly Message

### A WEEK WITH THE WORSHIP/MUSIC DIRECTOR

If you've been following these columns, you probably understand that working in ministry means that no two days are ever the same. A simple phone call can change not only a day, but an entire week.

There are those things that I do every week. I am present at all five of the weekend Masses. I provide music for the 5:30, 8:30, 10:30, and 12:30 Masses. At the 4:00 Mass, I help to coordinate ministries for the Mass and serve as a liaison between the parish and the visiting priest. During the school year, I play for the school Mass on Tuesday mornings. I also play and/or sing for all of the funerals and weddings in both parishes. This week we had four funerals and a wedding! It's been a busy week.

Much of my time during the week is spent in preparation for these liturgies. I make phone calls to priests around the diocese seeking presiders for the 4:00PM Mass. Occasionally I also have to find coverage for the weekday Masses if Fr. Philip's job at the Chancery takes him out of town. I try to stay at least one month ahead in scheduling for the 4:00 PM Mass.

I read the readings for upcoming liturgies multiple times trying to find music that fits the liturgical, musical, and pastoral judgment in music preparation. Once the music for a month is chosen, I post it to the *OLMC/STM Music Program* website ([home.catolbert.insightbb.com](http://home.catolbert.insightbb.com); it's actually my own website, but I use it for the music program).

This time of year I spend a lot of time meeting with wedding couples to plan their wedding liturgy and rehearse with other musicians they may want to use. For an upcoming wedding, I will be playing with two keyboardists and a trumpeter, so I am coordinating, transcribing, and transposing music to make sure we all have everything in the same key since we won't be able to rehearse until the day of the wedding. I also lead the wedding rehearsals (not just the music rehearsal).

As Father mentioned in his announcements at Mass last weekend, we've been recording the homilies and posting them to the internet. Using a small digital recorder, I record the whole Mass. Then during the following week, I transfer it to my computer where I can edit it down to just the homily. Then, that file is converted from a .wav file to an .mp3 file so it's small enough to transfer via the internet. Once this processing is done, I email the file to Ray Crider who posts it to the website ([www.olmc-louisville.com](http://www.olmc-louisville.com)).

There are many more things to do (writing a bulletin column, copying readings for lectors, meetings, more meetings!), but I'm afraid I'm out of room. See you at church!

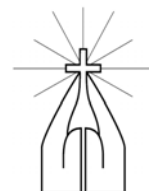
## Pope Benedict XVI Prayer Intentions August 2009

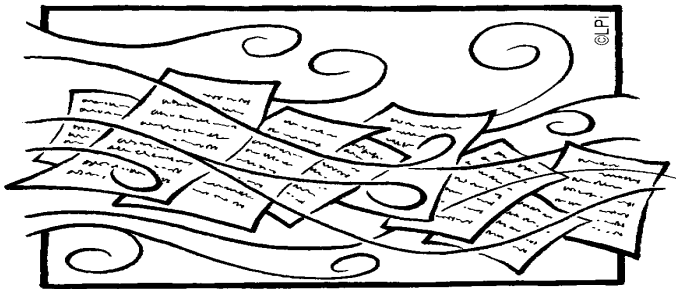
### En Theos — Enthusiasm For The Faith

#### *What preparations did Pope John XXIII enact during the spring and summer of 1959 to prepare for the ecumenical council?*

Fifty years ago newly-elected Pope John XXIII announced his desire to convoke an ecumenical council. His announcement encountered a variety of reactions and objections. However, John felt compelled to pursue his Spirit-led desire for a council.

In May 1959, John established an Ante-Preparatory Commission whose task was to survey the world's bishops and other interested parties on topics the council should address. The commission, led by Cardinal Tardini, wrote an open letter requesting suggestions of topics and areas of concerns that the council might address.

The letter, of June 18, 1959, stated "the Venerable Pontiff wants to know the opinion or views and to obtain the suggestions and wishes of their excellencies, the bishops and prelates who are summoned."



Some 2,598 letters were sent, and 1,998 responses were returned, an excellent response rate of seventy-seven percent. The shortest response was six lines from the bishop of Wollongong in Australia, while the longest response was twenty-seven pages from the cardinal archbishop of Guadalajara, Mexico. The information gathered in response to the June letter filled twelve volumes.

This comprehensive and consultative preparation set in motion the groundbreaking ecumenical council.

## The Senior Connection

*News from Better Business Bureau of Louisville*

**21st Century Legal Services** – has an F rating with the Better Business Bureau. The company promises to help restructure loans, but asks for a fee up front. It advises consumers to stop payment on their home loan but fails to provide the services promised. One local woman gave the company \$3,000 and didn't get anything in return.

**The Shoppers Sweepstakes** - This company claims to be accredited by the Better Business Bureau and sponsored by groups like Microsoft and Wal-Mart. The letter states your name was randomly selected to win \$250,000. A check for \$4,795 is enclosed. You are told to wire part of the money back for "applicable taxes." Later, you find out you really weren't a winner, and the check was fake.

**Neverpayitback.com** - charges \$2.78 for a 7 day trial to their service – a database of grant resources. After the 7 day trial, \$29.95 is charged for a monthly membership fee. BBB warns that you shouldn't have to pay a membership fee to apply for grants. For information on government grants go to [www.grants.gov](http://www.grants.gov).

**Cash for Clunkers Scams** – In response to the new Car Allowance Rebate System (CARS) passed by President Obama, scam artists are offering to pre-register you, but instead they are really stealing your personal information. You don't have to sign up or be pre-approved; the car dealers handle all of the paperwork. The official website for the program is [www.cars.gov](http://www.cars.gov).

**3hourprofits.com** – is an email work-at-home scam that has been using the BBB name to boost its reputation. The website claims employees can make over \$10,000 a month. The website claims the "BBB Review" rated it the number one work from home opportunity. There is no such thing as the "BBB Review637-9786. For free transportation from STM and OLMC, call 364-9029.

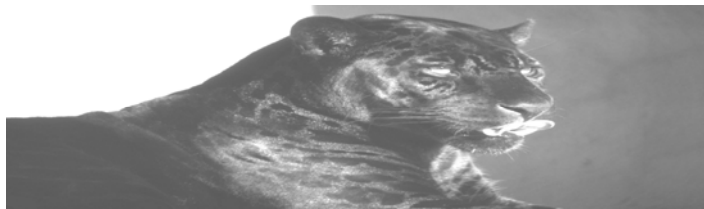

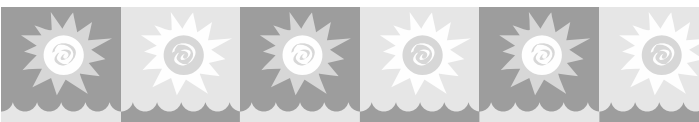
