Gospel Reflection

MAKING THE MOST OF THE OPPORTUNITY

The Letter to the Ephesians speaks to us, urging wisdom in our discernment of how to live the Christian life. We are to “watch carefully . . . making the most of opportunity,” and “try to understand what is the will of the Lord.” (5:15).

We are promised a generous outpouring of God’s help in our attempts to live the gospel: the Eucharist. This is the “living bread,” the Body and Blood of the Lord. To those who can only think literally, this seems not only foolish, but repulsive as well. We need to have more wisdom, understanding, and faith to understand properly what we have been asked to believe.

For our bread, which is food, and our wine, which is drink, to be transformed from things that give life to the body into Christ, who gives life to the soul, another great transformation must take place. Not only are the physical elements transformed, we are transformed as well. If we become people of Wisdom, eating of this banquet, we become one with Christ, who is one with God. We become the Body of Christ, his living and real presence.

FOR THE LIFE OF THE WORLD

This wisdom for us is foolishness to the world. But there is a saying, “The proof of the pudding is in the eating.” When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we become

what we eat; that is, we become one with the Lord and with each other. The proof of this is in our love. If we love God, if we love each other, and if we love others and serve them in charity, our love will be living proof of God’s life and work in the world. We truly become the Body of Christ.

Upon receiving the information, I read through it and check to see what is dated (what is happening on or has a deadline of a certain date) and what is filler information that is of interest to people but not dated. I then try to discern what has priority and is most important to the majority of our parishioners. I keep all information and only discard it when it is no longer of use, both hard copy and on my computer.

Some bulletin information is collected from Liturgical publications that we keep on hand at the office. I read through and select column information and sort through clip art that will go along accordingly with what is needed to be printed for the week.

Other information is generated by Fr. Philip and our Directors of Religious Education and Worship. Due to their busy schedules, things may happen where I offer to find filler from the above mentioned books or articles I have read or art that I have seen on a number of Catholic web-sites.

I compile to the best of my ability the information that is most important to you and add to it art that I hope will draw interest from you and be found pleasing to the eye.

Upon completion of the copy for the week, I check to see the number of bulletins that were printed for the previous week and how many were left over. Then keeping in mind factors such as the time of year, holiday weekends, and special events that may be taking place, I try determine the number of bulletins to print for the current week.

I run them on one machine, fold them on another and stuff them, sometimes helped by **good friends :-)** ! At last I put them in the churches for you to get, and hopefully read for information about a variety of Catholic things , especially those here at OLMC and STM!!

Please let me know if you have information that needs to be shared with others in our Parish Communities!

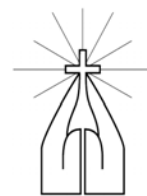
Pope Benedict XVI Prayer Intentions August 2009

If you are not active Your help is needed! If you are active, Thank You for all you do for our parishes!

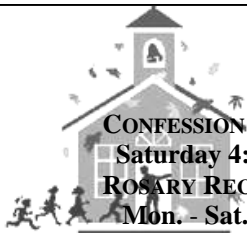



Weekly Message:

En Theos — Enthusiasm For The Faith

What do we affirm on August 22 when we proclaim and celebrate the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary?

The feast of the Queenship of Mary was instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1954, and was originally celebrated on May 31, the month of the May crowning of Mary. Today the memorial is celebrated on August 22, eight days after August 15, the feast of the Assumption of Mary into heaven.



In 1950 Pope Pius XII had already proclaimed as an infallible doctrine of the Church the long-held belief of the Assumption of Mary, which asserts that Mary was "taken up body and soul into heaven." As early as the fourth century it was believed that once Mary was assumed into heaven, Jesus, her son, "the king of heaven," crowned his mother "queen of heaven." Christian poetry and art from the time of Constantine proclaim this belief concerning Mary.

Once Christianity gained power and prestige under Roman emperor Constantine, the simple first-century Jewish life of Jesus and Mary of Nazareth was exalted to that of king of heaven and queen mother. Borrowing from both biblical images and Roman political structure, heaven became the royal court and the apostles were its senate. The angels became the household of the heavenly court, and the saints were guests seeking audience and bringing gifts.

What modern images of Jesus and Mary could we cultivate to speak powerfully to today's world?

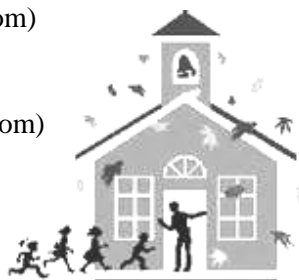
