Gospel Reflection

A TIME TO REWIND . . .

In the middle of today's Gospel passage, Jesus speaks of "[e]veryone who listens to these words of mine and acts on them" (Matthew 7:24). But he is not merely referring to his previous dire warning about those who cry "Lord, Lord" not necessarily entering into the kingdom. He is referring to the entire stretch of teaching we know as the "Sermon on the Mount"—the Gospel readings that we have been listening to for the past five Sundays. These include some of the best-known, most-loved, and "toughest teachings" portions of the Gospels: the Beatitudes, be reconciled before you bring your gift to the altar, love your enemies, consider the birds of the air and the flowers of the field, and today's conclusion with the houses built on sand and on rock. The evangelist Matthew uses this protracted sermon (which comes from a mountain, like Israel's commandments) to portray Jesus as rabbi, as teacher, to the new Israel, the early Christian community. It is to *all* these words that Jesus refers. And it is *all* of these words that we must listen to . . . and act upon.

AND A TIME TO FAST-FORWARD

The Sermon on the Mount is a compendium of what it means to live the will of God on earth, as it is in the kingdom of heaven. Jesus concludes this teaching with a "sneak preview" of the last day, when we will find out it



is not merely enough to cry "Lord, Lord" or to speak or act continually with the name of Jesus on our lips. Jesus addresses one of the issues that has occupied and divided Christianity for generations: faith and action. Jesus affirms that we cannot separate the two. Our relationship with God is like our relationships with anyone we love. It is not enough merely to repeat their names over and over, or to say "I love you" again and again. Day by day, we have to

live out that love in action; saying the names of loved ones and saying "I love you" will happen as part of this, but it is not enough by itself. If we truly love God's will and heed Jesus' teachings about what it means to let God's will reign in our lives, then our lives will be built on a solid foundation, and we will—on that last day—be welcomed into the kingdom of heaven.

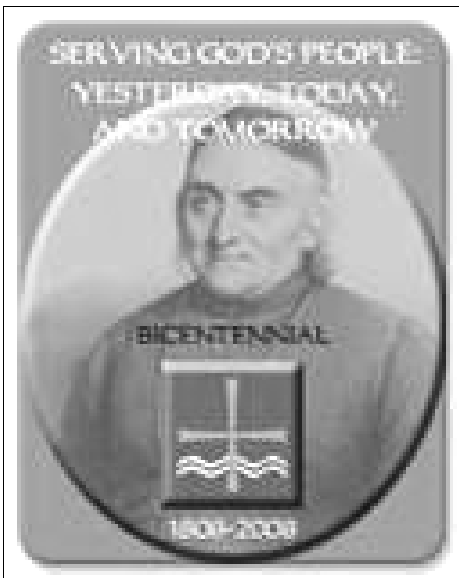

En Theos — Enthusiasm For The Faith

Why will we hear so many selections from Paul's letter to the Romans at Mass this year?

Paul's letter to the Romans is a formal document written to a community that Paul had not visited or known. He is writing from Corinth around the years 57-58, introducing himself to the Romans, asking for their support in his missionary work, while presenting his message and teachings concerning Jesus.



This letter presents the best exposition of Paul's theological reflection and spirituality. It is rich in insights about fallen humanity, God's saving grace in Christ, justification and salvation, life in the Spirit, the fate of Jews who have rejected Christ, and ultimate trust and reliance on God's mercy. Exhortations to love one another and not to judge each other round out what some call Paul's "gospel."

The letter struggles with the key issue pertinent to Christian living, namely justification or salvation through faith alone. Christians for generations have argued whether it is faith that saves or good works that save. Luther's battle cry was faith alone. Catholics insisted that good works were essential. Paul asserts that both are necessary for salvation to take hold. Justification is a free gift from God in Christ to which Christians must respond in faith. But all Christians must show that faith operative in their actions.

We take time during these summer Sundays to reflect and pray over these core issues in Christian living. How will you make Paul's words part of your prayerful reflection and sharing with others?

Progressive Solemnity

In Catholic liturgy there is universality to our worship experience. If you attend Mass in another country, you may not speak the language, but you'll recognize the large elements of the Mass; Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and Concluding Rites.

Within that framework, there are many elements that change at different times throughout the year. This is known as *Progressive Solemnity*.

Progressive Solemnity simply means that every liturgy should not be entirely like every other liturgy. Some elements of this are built into our liturgical calendar. For example, we do not sing the *Alleluia* during the Season of Lent. We don't sing the *Gloria* during the Seasons of Advent or Lent. We use incense during the great feast days of the Church and throughout the seasons that follow them.

We are now in the Season of Ordinary Time, and our liturgy should reflect this. For this reason, we will not be singing the *Glory to God* during the summer months.

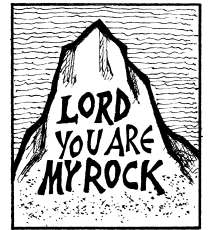

The Senior Connection

How Age Affects Driving

Although driving may seem easy and natural, it becomes more difficult as we age, therefore, understanding the process of aging and how it affects our driving can

prove very beneficial. A better understanding may even save someone's life-- including our own. There are three steps involved in the process of driving: sensing, deciding and acting.

Sensing. We receive 85 percent of the information necessary to drive through our eyes. Typically our eyesight begins to decline as we age and we lose our ability to clearly distinguish details particularly when driving.

Deciding. Once we take in information through our senses, we have to process the information which slows down with increasing age. While most older drivers avoid situations where their limitations put them at risk, (they drive less after dark, during rush hour, or in bad weather,) there are others who resist putting restrictions on themselves and continue to drive anywhere, anytime. These drivers pose a hazard to themselves and to others.

Acting. Older drivers experience weaker muscles, reduced flexibility, and limited range of motion and are unable to grip and turn the steering wheel, press the accelerator or brake, or reach to open doors and windows. Additionally, 80 percent of people in their 80s and older suffer from arthritis, a crippling inflammation of the joints, which makes turning, flexing, and twisting painful. Older drivers also take more medications and many of the medications can cause drowsiness, sap energy, slow reaction times, and otherwise affect driving ability.

So what can older drivers do when faced with some of the above situations? One solution is to use a tool designed to assess an older drivers' skills. Self-assessment prompts the driver not only to recognize and correct possible shortcomings, but also to plan ahead for inevitable effects of aging. AARP's self-assessment tool "Creating Mobility Choices" offers advice based on self assessment exercises. For your copy call 800-424-3410.

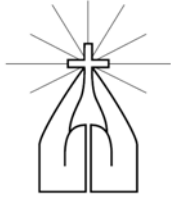
