FLESH AND BLOOD

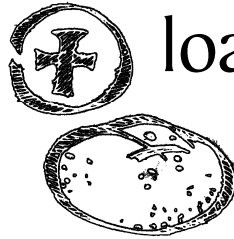
The intimate bond that unites families is well described by the phrase “flesh and blood.” “How can you treat your own flesh and blood so harshly?” a father might ask his son. “I can’t give up my baby for adoption; she’s my own flesh and blood,” a daughter may say to her mother. “I love you as though you were my own flesh and blood,” a brother might say to a stepbrother. It is as though our families are an inseparable part of us. Even those who have traumatic or abusive experiences with family members recognize the depth of emotional and spiritual connection we have with our families.

In Jesus’ words to the crowds in today’s Gospel we hear him talk about our participation in the Eucharist as a sharing in his own flesh and blood. Through the Eucharist Christ himself dwells in us. His divine and eternal life courses through our veins. Like a family gathered at table, we become more and more intimately connected with Christ and one another. As Paul tells us, “We, though many, are one body” (1 Corinthians 10:17), united as members of Christ’s own flesh and blood.

FOR THE LIFE OF THE WORLD

Within the Body of Christ today, many are suffering as Jesus once did, and the suffering of one of our “brothers and sis-

ters” should be of deep concern to us. We who partake of the Body and Blood of Christ must be prepared to be broken and poured out as Jesus was “for the life of the world” (John 6:51). We must become willing to suffer ourselves if it will benefit a member of our own “flesh and blood.”

As you receive Holy Communion this week, open your heart to the intimate connections that unite us as family within the Body of Christ. Then reflect on how those bonds will affect the way you treat your own flesh and blood this week.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Corpus Christi Procession

In the thirteenth century, a Belgian nun by the name of Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's feast of *Corpus Christi*—the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—grew from Juliana's vision.

On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional *Corpus Christi* procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The *Corpus Christi* procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. 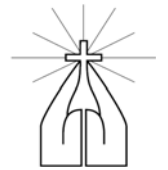
FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus, too, speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.

Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems and issues-good and bad-of child-rearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed. A response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail.

## Tom's Meanderings

A couple of weeks ago, several of us from our parishes attended a conference entitled "THE MASS: AN EXPLORATION OF OUR CATHOLIC IDENTITY" Presented by Fr Tom Richstatter, OFM, professor at St Meinrad and author of several *Catholic Updates*.

He had a lot of interesting things to say, so on this day when we celebrate The Body and Blood of Jesus – *Corpus Christi*, as we used to call it – I thought it would be good to share a few of his thoughts. After all, we can't celebrate this Feast without talking about The Mass.

As you recall the Gospel we heard a couple of weeks ago about the disciples on their way to Emmaus after Jesus' death. Jesus met them on the road, talked with them about the Scriptures, ate with them, and then they felt they had to share the Good News. Fr Tom said that this is the outline for our Community Mass. We come together (Gathering), we hear stories of our Faith (Readings), we share a meal (Communion), and respond (Go and spread the Word.)

He pointed out that many of us don't really know what a meal is. We hear about "Happy Meals" and "Do you want to make that a meal?" To really "make it a meal," we need to actually sit down and get into one another's lives. We may have eaten food, but we haven't sat down for a meal. In the past week, how often have you sat down for a meal? Fr Tom said that when he had a friend over for dinner, the friend commented that he wasn't sure if he remembered how to use a fork since most of his eating was sandwiches, fries, etc. It's a sad state of affairs. After all, Jesus did say "Take and Eat...Take and Drink" Eucharist is about eating and drinking – in community. Enjoy a meal this week.

**The Senior Connection  
Transportation Voucher  
Program for Seniors**

KIPDA, in partnership with Louisville Wheels (Meals on Wheels), has implemented a transportation voucher pilot project in Jefferson County.

The voucher program assists seniors age 60 and older to obtain and pay for transportation to medical appointments, including trips to doctor's appointments, medical treatments, lab work, and ongoing treatments such as dialysis.

Clients participating in the voucher project are responsible for identifying the individual who will provide transportation (you pay someone you know to drive his/her own car). The voucher option is intended for persons who can make their own travel arrangements with a transportation provider willing and able to provide a ride. The established reimbursement rate is \$7.00 one-way or \$14.00 round trip.

The vouchers can be used to reimburse a transportation provider for trips to non-emergency medical appointments only. Trips for other purposes will not be reimbursed. The voucher program is not intended to replace an existing transportation service, unless there are extenuating circumstances.

If you are interested in participating in the transportation voucher program, you need to call KIPDA at 502-266-5571 and someone there will help you complete an application. If you just want information about the program, you should also contact someone at KIPDA at 502-266-5571.
