## Gospel Reflection

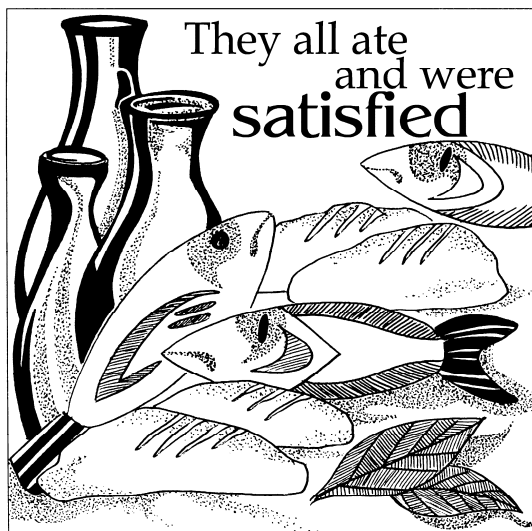
### LISTEN HEEDFULLY

The invitation to come and satisfy our hunger and thirst in Christ offers a great comfort to us who sometimes ache with longing for God or feel emptiness when we want to feel full of God's love. This longing is God's gift and call to us to withdraw from all the noise and racket of our lives and our world and pay attention to the quiet voice of God within us. How do we respond to such a loving invitation?

By paying attention, by stilling ourselves; not by struggling and striving to make some spiritual experience happen, but just by sitting still and listening for God's delicate promptings. Our desire for prayer, even if we feel our prayer to be too distracted and ineffective, is effective because the call is from God and our response is a willingness to hear and be fed by God's holy word to us.

### ALL ATE AND WERE SATISFIED

Jesus fed the five thousand men, "not counting women and children" (Matthew 14:21). We can assume, since women were among his most faithful followers and they tend to bring their children with them everywhere, that the women and children outnumbered the men—a vast crowd indeed! Yet how were they fed with five loaves

and two fish? Matthew notes that first, "[Jesus] said the blessing" (Matthew 14:19). He gave thanks to God for what was given: an act of thanksgiving that is always transformative. This act of praise and thanks transforms our bread into his body and blood, and conforms us to Christ for the life of the world. The desire for God is a gift that reflects God's desire for us. It doesn't matter if we feel that our prayer is ineffective, or if we are comforted or not by our images of God. God is working in us by the gift of that desire, and our will to

respond is our consent to God's call. Come to the water; come to the feast!

The most conservative estimate of the loss of life was 22, the majority being Catholic.

## Weekly Message:

### En Theos — Enthusiasm For The Faith

*I've heard of the Dominicans. Who are they, and when did they begin?*

The greatest contribution made to the church by Dominic, a Spaniard born around 1170, was to establish the Order of Friars Preachers, commonly known as the Dominicans. Dominicans today continue to advocate for excellent preaching that will move people to conversion and deeper relationship with God.

Dominic, a priest whose feast we celebrate on August 8, was asked by Pope Innocent III (1198-1216) to take the lead in fighting the Albigensian heresy that was creating much confusion and conflict in southern France. To counter the disarray and misinformation Dominic devoted himself to effective preaching and to providing solid education in church teaching and beliefs. But he knew that this was not enough. Prayer was the essential ingredient that had to suffuse all that he did.

Prayer became an integral part of his service to God's people. In 1215, when he established the Order of Friars Preachers, he made certain that both prayer and education were the key pillars of his order. These pillars would facilitate development of excellent preaching skills, something Dominic saw as severely lacking. In the mid-fifteenth century, Dominic's prayer focus led to the development of a rich legend in which Mary presented Dominic with the rosary. The Dominicans promoted the rosary devotion so much that today it is still referred to as the Dominican rosary.

## A Little Liturgy: by Chris Tolbert

### The Eucharistic Prayer - Continued

Recall from my last column that The Eucharistic Prayer is a single prayer made up of eight separate elements.

Praise and Thanksgiving  
Acclamations  
Epiclesis  
Institution Narrative and Consecration  
Anamnesis  
Offering  
Intercessions  
Doxology/Great Amen

I touched upon the first two last week. This week I'll pick up with number 3, the Epiclesis.

*Epiclesis* is Greek for "invocation." It is a calling-down of the Holy Spirit. There are two epiclesis in each Eucharistic Prayer, one before the consecration and one afterward.

With the first epiclesis, the celebrant prays that God will send down His Holy Spirit to change this bread and wine into the Body and Blood of His Son. Here is an example of the pre-consecration epiclesis from Eucharistic Prayer II (you'll probably recognize the text):

*Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ.*

The second or post-consecration epiclesis prays for us:

*May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit.*

It's important to remember that Christ is present in three places in the liturgy; the consecrated Body and Blood, the Word, and Us!

## The Senior Connection

### Exemptions for Property Owners

Property owners Age 65 and older are eligible for the **Homestead Exemption**. Those who currently receive the exemption need not reapply. Anyone age 65 or older who has never applied should follow **Application Procedures** listed below. Property owners who have been declared totally disabled by any public or private retirement system for the previous 12 months may be eligible for the **Disability Exemption**. Kentucky law requires that every person who receives the "disability exemption" must reapply each year with the PVA.

If property owners are eligible for either exemption-- **Homestead or Disability**, the PVA office will subtract the amount of the exemption from the property's assessed value. This means that these people will **pay less property tax**, and could save hundreds of dollars each year. According to Kentucky statutes, the exemption amount is increased every two years. The exemption amount for the year 2007-2008 is **\$31,400**. Only one exemption is allowed per household.

**Application Procedures.** Applications are available at the PVA office (574-4204), or online at [www.pvalouky.org](http://www.pvalouky.org). You can also visit your local government centers (Southwest – 7219 Dixie Highway or Central – 7201 Outer Loop) and ask for an application. A completed application, along with a copy of your driver's license or birth certificate, should be mailed to the Office of the Jefferson County PVA. Either "Homestead Exemption" or

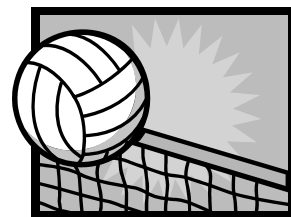

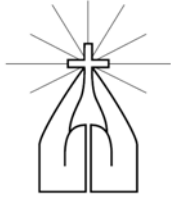
